- Viola:** The viola has a rhythmic pattern in the **Maestoso** section with a fortissimo (*ff*) dynamic.
- Violoncello & Contrabass:** Both the cello and double bass have a rhythmic pattern in the **Maestoso** section with a fortissimo (*ff*) dynamic, transitioning to a more melodic line in the **Adagio** section with a mezzo-piano (*mp*) dynamic.
